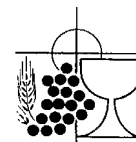

Saint Pius X is perhaps best remembered for his encouragement of the frequent reception of Holy Communion, especially by children. The second of ten children in a poor Italian family, Joseph Sarto, at 68, became Pope Pius X, one of the 20<sup>th</sup> century's greatest Popes. Ever mindful of his humble origin, he stated, "I was born poor, I lived poor, I will die poor." He was embarrassed by some of the pomp of the papal court. "Look how they have dressed me up," he said in tears to an old friend. To another, "It is a penance to be forced to accept all the practices. They lead me around surrounded by soldiers, like Jesus when he was seized in Gethsemane."

On the 11<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his election as Pope, Europe was plunged into World War I. He had foreseen it, but it killed him. "This is the last affliction the Lord will visit on me. I would gladly give my life to save my poor children from this gastly scourge." He died a few weeks after the war began. Describing Pius X, a historian wrote that he was "**a man of God who knew the unhappiness of the world and the hardships of life, and in the greatness of his heart wanted to comfort everyone.**"
