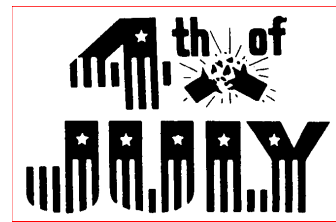

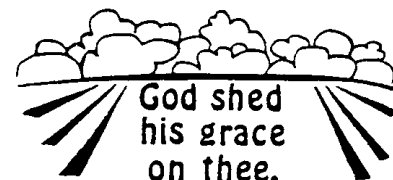
WE THE PEOPLE.....

Welcome to: **Ethan Gerard Sebastian**, the newest member of our Christian community, he recently received the Sacrament of Baptism in our church.

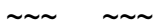

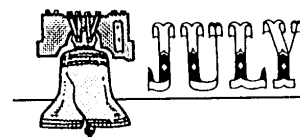
