Fatima Devotions

On May 13, 1917, during the First World War, the Blessed Virgin appeared to three children in Fatima, Portugal. She told the children to give the world a message that would bring the war to an end. The message asked for the recitation of the daily rosary, Mass and Communion on five First Saturdays, and daily penance. Portugal and Ireland heeded the message and lived it. They were not involved in the Second World War.
