My dear friends in Christ,

At Baptism, each of us is given the responsibility to be a missionary – to share our faith and to be active participants in the Church's mission to all peoples.

World Mission Sunday, celebrated this year on October 22, gives us the opportunity to reach out in faith to more than two-thirds of the world's people who have yet to hear the "Good News" of Jesus Christ, their Savior, or to experience – through the word and witness of missionaries – His abiding love. On World Mission Sunday, within the context of the Eucharist, we can offer our prayers and support, through the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, for the mission of making Jesus known "to the ends of the earth."
