Return all envelopes by November 2, so that your loved ones can be remembered in a Novena of Masses, which is dedicated to the Holy Souls.

Fatima Devotions

A popular legend tells us that the Rosary, or "garland of roses" was given to St. Dominic by the Blessed Mother when she appeared to him. Historians believe that the Rosary evolved from religious traditions practiced between the 12th and 15th centuries. In those early days of the church, monks were known to recite 150 psalms of David in repetitious prayer. Lay people adopted the monks' practice by saying 150 repetitions of the Our Father. To keep count, they would carry strings of knots or beads. What eventually evolved was the Rosary as we know it today.

The rosary was also believed to be a powerful agent of miraculous intervention. Don Juan of Austria, after his 16th century defeat of the Mohammedan Turks, proclaimed that it was "neither generals nor battalions nor arms that brought us to victory....but Our Lady of the Rosary."

Won't you join with us for the recitation of the Rosary on Saturday, November 4, at 8:40AM in the Church?
