Fatima Devotions

The battle of Lepanto in 1571 saved Christian Europe. Unlike a historian, the Church views such an event personally. She had prayed to the Mother of God, through the Rosary for the result. The feast, then, is one of thanksgiving in her honor.

When Our Lady appeared to Bernadette at Lourdes in 1858, they prayed the Rosary together. Bernadette never forgot the way Our Lady taught her to say it. Bernadette tells of one apparition. "The Lady's eyes left me for a moment and looked into the distance above my head. When she looked at me again, I asked what had made her so sad and she said simply, 'Pray for sinners!'" The world needs the Rosary! How fitting that our Fatima Devotion this month should fall of the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary as it was on this date in 1571 when the forces of Islam were defeated in that historic battle of Lepanto.
