One of the sweetest gifts that children give to their mothers is a bouquet of flowers that symbolizes how much they love her. Mary, the Mother of Jesus, is the Mother of the World. Since Mary is in Heaven, it is not easy for our children to understand how to show that they love her.

Teaching our children to pray the Rosary is one way that we can help them to pray to the Blessed Mother Mary. The Rosary is a beautiful bouquet of prayers that shows Mary how much we love her.

The repetition of the Rosary helps children to learn some of the most important prayers of the Catholic faith.
