Another EKG and already he sees an improvement over last week. ALLELUIA! I thank God, and I thank you for your prayers and good wishes. See you soon, I hope! Meanwhile, stay tuned for the next exciting episode from your Kindly Pastor. May God continue to bless and protect us.
