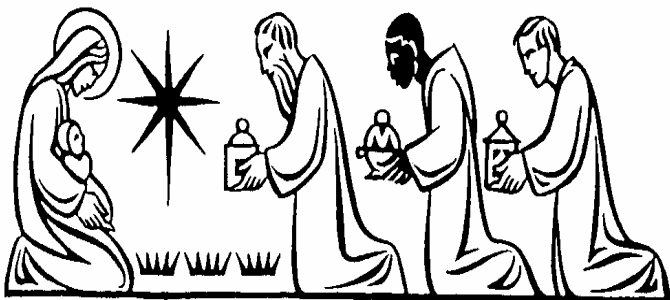

When we reflect on the narrative of the Three Wise Men, it is important for us to remember that the star was up there for everyone to see. We cannot identify with precision which star it was that guided them to the place of Jesus' birth. Scripture scholars and astronomers have developed certain theories about what caused a certain star to shine with particular brilliance at that time. But they are only theories. Whatever the cause, the real lesson of the story is that it was the "Wise Men from the East" who were able to read the meaning of the star and follow it. The Epiphany event is a beautiful example of God pouring His love into the minds and hearts of those who seek the truth. The Wise Men's lifestyle of searching, questioning, learning, being open to new possibilities for their life, is one of the strong traditions of the Bible. And it was in this expansive spirit of willingness to learn and to believe that they followed the "new and living path" Jesus was opening up for them. With a new song in their hearts, they followed the Star of Bethlehem until they "found the Child with Mary His Mother. They prostrated themselves and did Him homage." (Mt. 2:11)
